[MEDIA RELEASE] Inaugural Eurasian Association Football Camp 2023 with the four Self-Help Groups

19 June 2023 – The Eurasian Association (EA), in partnership with its fellow Self-Help Groups (SHGs); Chinese Development Assistance Council (CDAC), Yayasan MENDAKI (MENDAKI), and the Singapore Indian Development Association (SINDA), launched the inaugural multi-racial football camp for 7 to 12-year-old children at the Jalan Besar Stadium this morning.

Guest-of-Honour, Senior Parliamentary Secretary, Ministry of Culture, Community and Youth & Ministry of Social and Family Development, Mr Eric Chua, was present, with EA President Ms Sandra Theseira, CDAC Executive Director Mr Tan Yap Kin, SINDA CEO Mr Anbarasu Rajendran, MENDAKI CEO Mdm Zuraidah Abdullah, Sport Singapore Deputy CEO Mr Toh Boon Yi and Singapore Pools Senior Director of Community Partnerships and Communications Mr Chin Sau Ho.

The three-day camp brings together close to 100 children from the four SHGs and special guests from SportCares, with a finale tournament to wrap up the camp. It is sponsored by Singapore Pools, and supported by Sport Singapore and ActiveSG Football Academy with the venue and coaches. It aims to bring children from different races and backgrounds together, and to promote racial harmony and inclusivity through sport. A first iteration of this camp with about 30 children from EA, MENDAKI and SINDA was held in 2022.

Senior Parliamentary Secretary Mr Eric Chua, who launched the event, highlighted the role Self-Help Groups play, and their collaborative efforts in bringing children from different cultures together.

"This first Football Camp involving our Self-Help Groups is a commendable effort in reaching out to our young and supporting their all-rounded development, beyond academics. Bringing together our children through sport offers them an opportunity to interact and bond with peers across communities and cultures. This effort reflects the important role SHGs continue to play as part of a wider network to strengthen social cohesion in Singapore."
