[MEDIA RELEASE] LAUNCH OF THE 2ND EDITION OF THE SINGAPORE EURASIAN FAMILY HISTORY EXHIBITION

24 September 2022 - The Eurasian Association (EA) launched the 2nd edition of the Singapore Eurasian Family History Exhibition (SEFHE) this morning at the Eurasian Community House. Member-of-Parliament Christopher de Souza who represents the Ulu Pandan ward of Holland-Bukit Timah GRC was the Guest-of-Honour.

The exhibition, which will run from 24 September to 23 October at the Eurasian Community House, aims to encourage Eurasian families in Singapore to trace their family history and share it with the Eurasian Heritage Gallery (EHG) as a record for future generations. It also aims to increase public awareness on Eurasian history, and how the Eurasian community has contributed to the multi-cultural fabric of the nation.

31 Eurasian family trees are on display at this year's exhibition, with each family tracing their family lineage between five to more than eight generations. Following the event, all family trees will be incorporated into a permanent exhibit at the Eurasian Heritage Gallery in an A3 flip book, and there will be a virtual tour on the Eurasian Association's website (https://www.eurasians.sg).

EA President Sandra Theseira shared, "Eurasian families in Singapore have an interesting cultural mix of East and West, which is worth recording. We hope that more people will be inspired to trace their family roots and do up their own family trees, and that members of the public can also learn more about the history of Eurasians in Singapore."
